

Seneschal's Comments

Dear Populace

In the absence of inspiration I thought I might write about the unhappy topic of criticism.

People do and say things that upset others, or which strike them just as not the best way to address a given problem. When that happens, there expectation in the Society that they should be given the benefit of the doubt as regards their intentions namely, that the offending act or words should be interpreted in their best light, e.g., as having been made with the belief they were for the good of the barony, were not selfserving, were not intended as an insult, and so on. This may be difficult to do. If it cannot be done without

lobotomising yourself first, the expectation is that you will at least keep suspicions of bad faith or ill will to yourself.

Everybody knows this of course. And also that if you have criticism to make, it should be done in a timely manner, and to the face of the person giving the alleged offence.

It might not be made immediately of course. People may wish to discuss the behaviour with their friends to make sure their perception of it was reasonable. However, the line between validation by peers and backbiting is fine.

There are some kinds if criticism that you can't

expect to be made to your face. Ιf someone finds behaviour another's intimidating or creepy, then they are unlikely to approach them about it for precisely that reason. What they could do ideally is talk to that person's Peer (if they have one), their superior officer, or even a mutual friend (if there is one) rather than spreading discord through the group.

Patterns of Fashion: The Cut and Construction of clothes for men and women c1560-1620 by Janet Arnold

What is it?

This is one of the books for people interested in 16th century costuming. The late, great Janet highly Arnold was a costume respected historian whose books are much used by SCAdians. particular This book contains patterns drafted by Arnold from extant (surviving) garments throughout Europe including Italy, Germany, England and Sweden. The front section of the book is an analysis of the different garments in the book and includes closeup shots of the garments as well as portraits from the time showing people wearing similar fashions. The rest of the book is

devoted to line drawings and patterns of the various garments including doublets, hats, cloaks, dresses and loose gowns.

Who should use this book?

Anyone interested in any style of clothing from the middle to late 16th century - it is particularly handy that it includes both male and female items. Many of the bodices of Florentine and Venetian gowns used the Eleanor of Toledo pattern starting point. I have also found this an excellent book for providing inspiration - just looking through the pictures can be a good point to start researching a particular

style of clothing. It is also useful for getting an idea of how garments from this period were constructed if you are interested in more period methods tailoring. Beginner costumers might find redrafting the patterns to fit themselves something of a challenge however it is a good starting point for getting an idea of 16th century fashion is actually about!

This is a superb book on late 16th century and anyone looking at trying 16th century costume or already starting to make fashion of this period should get it out!



Mind Your Manners

A column to address matters of etiquette and fine manners

Further to last month's Mind Your Manners on attending Court, this month we consider topics relating to participating in Court.

I'm worried that I can't get up off the floor while wearing a long skirt

The Guards should help with this. One will have anticipated that a presentation to a lady is almost over and moved into position to offer you a hand. (This is easier and more immediate with a smaller court). If you are particularly honoured, His Majesty may choose to assist you Himself. Take the proffered hand and use it to assist your balance and help overcome your inertia when beginning to stand.

The ability to rise unassisted from the ground without catastrophe is a skill that you are likely to find useful outside of Court settings. You can reduce difficulties by lifting the front of your skirt slightly when you kneel to so that you have some slack when you come to stand. To avoid getting your skirt caught under your heels when you stand, fluff the back slightly as (or just before) you rise. Practice will help.

But I can't kneel

If you are aware you are going to be called up in Court, e.g. taking office or being elevated to a Peerage etc, you should take the time to discuss this well before the event. If you need to stand, or can kneel on a stool etc, this can be discussed and arranged so that everything happens smoothly on the day. Otherwise, a quiet word once you are within the Royal

Presence will usually be enough. Simply follow Their Majesties directions.

Who can make an announcement in Court?

Court can be a vehicle for getting important information to the people onsite. It is common for Stewards, sub-stewards and officers to make announcements pertaining to the event. However, as long as the announcement is appropriate and of sufficient importance, make anvone with announcement the permission of Their Majesties.

I have an announcement to make. What do I do?

The first step is to speak to the Herald organising the Court. This is vital. You will need to explain your announcement and then a decision will be made whether it will be included in the Court business. If it is not included it may be that the announcement is not appropriate to court, that it is better suited to a different court, or simply that Their Majesties are trying to stop the court getting ridiculously long.

If your item is included you must make sure you are there to be called up. The Herald may be able to give you an idea of when your item is scheduled in advance.

In Court, you should make your way to the Royal Presence, acknowledge Their Majesties (and any additional Heads of State) and ask permission to make an announcement. Permission received, you will then move to the side and speak your piece to the populace.

Endeavour to keep your speech short, clear and to the point. It is important to avoid upstaging Their Majesties (or Excellencies) or usurping Their duties. It is by Their gracious consent that you are permitted to take time from Their business for your own, so to step on Their toes would be unpardonably rude. Once you are done, again acknowledge Their Majesties, render courtesy at the edge of their Presence and return to your seat.

Of course, if you prefer to avoid public speaking, you may wish to ask the Herald to speak on your behalf.

What kind of announcements can I make?

Not all announcements are suitable for Court. Different Crowns and different locations have different ideas and traditions. Let yourself be guided by the advice of the Herald.

Generally speaking, an announcement for the good of the group or event is acceptable, as is something that constitutes an emergency (lost child or medication etc) or something that adds to the period flavour of the event. Political point scoring and self-aggrandisement etc are not normally tolerated.

Please note that although this column speaks in terms of Royal Courts and the King and Queen, it is also directly applicable to Courts held by the Prince and Princess of Lochac or territorial Barons and Baronesses.

MEETING OPENED: 7.39

LAST MEETING'S MINUTES: Accepted (Moved by Calach)

OFFICER REPORTS:

SENESCHAL (Oswyn): correspondence with b and b, Ross of Waipara regarding available dates and per head costs, with all officers regarding their duties and reporting: with Reeve regarding financial records and the state of the barony's finances; with KS regarding previous Quarterly report, Castelburn and walkie talkies; with KEM regarding Marshal's reports; with Kingdom Constable and KRM regarding new officer appointments; with stewards regarding BA, proposed Yule events and the tournament of Roses, cancelled due to poor weather. With QM and Chronicler regarding Baronial property in lockup; with owners of hall used for Council and activity nights; with Toa TV representative and populace concerning organising a demo to be recorded for television. With new Crescents officer, b and b, and Mistress katherine kerr regarding resources for pages.

CHATELAINE (Chunegund): First things first — I'm actually the chatelaine! It was confirmed on 13/04/10, after an email to Seneschal. We've had one more newcomer coming to Fighter's Practice, and he already has a full set of armour that he is now finetuning. Received back the last garb from BA. I 'attended' the Tournament of the Roses, but it was cancelled due to rain. The dancers have decided not to participate in the Crusaders demo, as most of them have too many clashes. I've sorted out some quotes for reprinting the flyers and business cards, and these will hopefully be approved at this council. I will be doing a stocktake of all the garb at some point, after I have the containers that are being reallocated from crockery storage

REEVE (Ginevra):

HERALD (Callum): I sent off a report to Crux. Very short cos I ain't done much in the last quarter but attend Baronial Ann and do court for the B & B.

MARSHAL (Raffe): After the fencing of our Deans Bush practice site we tried a couple of new locations and settled on Jellie Park on Ilam Rd as a good spot and there has been good turn outs of fighters over the last month. Best effort 11 fighters and usual is 7-8. 1 new fighter arrived with kit and joining in and 3-4 others making noises about getting kit together or coming along to see just how we hit each other. I've arranged for our alternate indoor venue (Showbiz 11 Balfour Tce) to be available from now until the end of July for those inclement days so we can carry on hitting each other even if it's raining!

CAPTAIN OF RAPIER (Ginevra): This will be my final report as I have been replaced in office by Lord Emilio de Battista, who I'm sure will do as excellent a performance in the role, as he did in that of Rapier Coordinator at CF this year. In the last 3 months we have had no authorisations. There has been one tournament, the Baronial Championship - Don Martuccio won. There were 4 combatants: Martuccio, Mahesti, Tycho, and James, in order of bouts won. It was Round Robin Style. Practices continue as in my last report. Sunday is starting to run into problems with the weather, leading to cancellations. Thank you to all for the support you have given me in this office.

CAPTAIN OF ARCHERS (Geoffrey):

Quarterly report submitted. Practices continuing as usual. Kirkwood booked the field to another group on the 18th, making archery impractical. Someone involved knew us, and let us know in advance. Since then, I have contacted the school and made sure they have our contact details, in the event this reoccurs.

They are aware that we are still using the field, and have no issues with this.

Obtained quotes for purchasing loaner bows

\$300 or less for two take-down recurve bows from Aim Tru. \$320 or more for similar bows from New Zealand Archery Products Also, Baron Bartholomew has offered to sell a longbow to the barony, for a price to be agreed to by the council.

Budget for combat arrows

Blunts - 20 puchased for \$1.64 each - total \$32.80 20 x 4 vanes - 25c each => \$20 for set. (feathers would be around \$60 total)

shafts - 8 lengths of dowel from Mitre 10 Mega, Ferrymead - about \$40 or less

Total - approx \$92.80

Maintenance of equipment - target faces, new target stands, loaner gear such as arm braces and finger tabs is required. This could be funded through a dollar coin donation at practises, by the people using the equipment. The process for this to be discussed at council. Planned schedule for IKAC shoots - every 6 weeks until end of season: June 20, August 1, September 12, October 24, November 28

Discussion followed this report. It was proposed that we buy 1 bow from aim tru @\$150, the loaner arrow supplies as outlined above for \$92.80, and the bow from Bartholomew for \$80, as that was indicated as being an appropriate price. This would come to \$322.80, which is about \$5 less than the funds raised at the CF 09 Archers Auction.

Proposed: Raffe, Seconded: Glen, Approved unanimously

As the funds collected at Archery practice for new supplies are likely to be minimal, it was decided that we trust Geoffrey to collect and disperse funds of up to \$50 without further approval from council.

Proposed: Chunegund, Seconded: Calach, Approved unanimously

Not much to say this quarter. No tourneys since BA and as we're heading into winter there aren't likely to be any before spring hits. I'm still planning on constructing a list tree for the Barony.

FIGHTING WEEKEND THING (RAFFE): Discussion was held over whether it would be a worthwhile idea to bring some fighters over from Oz to encourage fighting amongst the populace. It was decided that Raffe should come back with actual numbers. Funding was also discussed, and an understanding reached that any such event would be funded from future Fighter Auctions and fundraising rather than existing funds.

TENTATIVE BIDS FOR 2012: Discussion as to how far out from the event we are prepared to accept bids. It was decided that bids for 2012 would be happily heard if presented.

GENERAL BUSINESS:

CF 2012: We can have any period between the 27th Jan and 11th of Feb, but Ross would prefer that we only

used 1 weekend. The question was asked if the other people wanting the site were the same ones we shared with in '09, because if so, we could share again, setting up downstairs, while they had the upstairs. Carl to investigate.

FLYERS: Chunegund presented a list of comparative quotes for flyers, brochures and the business cards we use for recruiting. It was decided to go with Printshop, and utilise their currently offered deal on the business cards till 31 May, for a combined price of \$261.03. It was noted that we had \$200 from the website competition reserved for advertising/ recruitment. Proposed; Kotek, Seconded: Callum, APPROVED

WALKIE TALKIES: To Purchase (from Bartholomew):

- Battery: 3AA per unit
- Battery Life: 6 days with occasional use
- Signal Range: 600m through some trees & building clutter
- Signal Quality: ok if both outdoors, noticeable buzz if one or both indoors or around computers etc
- Channels: 4
- Other: small & light, belt clip, earphone/mic socket, selectable pager tone. No concerns about breaking or losing borrowed equipment
- Storage: ?? with baronial gear, no need to pickup/drop off
- Costs: \$59.70 (<\$15 ea) + batteries (estimate \$25 for sufficient AA batteries for all 4 units for duration of CF)

To borrow (from Tycho):

- Battery: integral
- Battery Life: roughly 1 day with regular use (from memory)
- Signal Range: in the kms
- Signal Quality: good, whether indoors or out or near electrical equipment
- Channels: 40+
- Other: battery charger, belt clip
- Storage: none, arrange pickup and drop off (eg at fight pracs etc)
- Cost: nil

After Testing, purchased of Walkie Talkies moved by Callum, seconded by Glenn. 3 against (2 proxies), remainder for, purchase APPROVED

SCANZ: This year, we will be hosting the AGM, sometime between 16 Oct to 16 Dec. It was briefly discussed if we would like to run an event to coincide with this. Lowrans would also like to state that his 3 years as our representative will be up on the 15th Nov, and he would like to retire from this position.

CASTLEBURN/ ST KESSOG St Kessog has started up and got a lot of new signups with the new academic year, with five people turing up to their first event. They are to have a potluck feast this weekend. Dauid has volunteered to drive down with a carload of people to provide support. Castelburn is officially dormant. Discussion was held as to what would happen if St Kessog goes the same way, with regard to the equipment and supplies that have been sent down over the years. Dauid is to investigate when he's down there.

HALLS: Raffe offered the Showbiz meeting room for Council Sessions in future. We could use it for Free. It was decided that this was a good idea, as it's a central location, and has plenty of parking. Slight discussion was held on the halls document that was handed out. Oswyn and Ginevra are to collate opinions from the populace, and then visit the more desirable ones, to get further information

OTHER BUSINESS:

CF – made a \$2500 profit, largely from food and T-shirts. The new Marquee was great and the people were far easier to deal with then Johnson and Couzins. It was also a LOT cheaper. Discussion was had as to whether a further debrief session is useful, or necessary. Discussion is proposed to be held over a beer sometime, the participants are advised to read the post event non financial report generated by Dauid and Ginevra, which can be obtained from Dauid or Oswyn.


