Hopefully we'll see some meetings being announced in the near future.

Sadly we have to farewell Maximillian, who is leaving our fair lands to take work in Auckland. A new Arts and Sciences officer is therefore sought. If you wish to apply for this position please send an application to Kingdom A&S, myself and the Baron and Baroness. I'd like to thank Max for his work in the role and wish him well in his travels .

Finding a venue for combined weekend fighting, archery, rapier practices and A&S is proving tricky, however efforts are still continuing. It's certainly been the experience of many groups that getting as many people as possible together to practice their various fields of interest encourages broader engagement both from the point of view of people trying out new things they might not otherwise make the effort to attend as well as socialising with more people. Southron Gaard Council Meeting

Wednesday 8th May 2014

PRESENT: Richard (Richard), Isabel Maria (Miriam), Philippe (Peter), Katherine (Vicki), Bartholomew (Peter), Maximilian (Will), Raffe (Shaun), Darayavaush (Damon), Eva (Sarah), Ceallach (Bevan), Cecily (Catherine), Amalie (Amy), Callum (Bob)

APOLOGIES: : Elena (Niamh), Oswyn (Carl), Lucia (Betty)

MEETING OPENED: 7:30pm

PREVIOUS MINUTES: Passed unanimously.

OFFICER REPORTS:

B&B (Oswyn and Isabel Maria): Correspondence with seneschal and Kingdom re events. With CCC re upcoming Heritage week. Banner project - no devent fabric found. Still looking.

SENESCHAL (Richard): Correspondence: Baronial Trailer sale (Lowrens) – The trailer was bought for \$1500. Thanks to Lord Raffe for dealing with the matters of warrants of fitness and handing the trailer over to the buyer. A small pile of items recovered from the trailer. Lowrens requires reimbursement of \$68.25. Items recovered includes ~120 small lunch baskets. No longer suitable for use with food due to rodent contact. Council's consensus to keep them as we may be able to sterilise them.

REEVE (Mahasti): (Mahasti, Ginevra, Myrun, Svartr) – quarterly report late. Tried to assist by hunting down transactions out of balance. Discussions with Mahasti, Myrun, Svartr regarding reconciling event stewards reports to bank account. Not easy sometimes but the attempt needs to be made. Canterbury Faire report needs this treatment to start with.

Note: Seneschal will be making an extra special effort to ensure that this improves over the next couple of years.

HERALD (Lucia): No report recieved.

ARTS AND SCIENCES (Maximilian): Since becoming A&S I have failed to attend any events, hosted 1 Stuff night (sparsely attended) and discussed with members of the populace where to hold A&S evenings, with the forerunner being Avice Hill Arts and Crafts. This has been scouted and appears to be well suited to our needs. I believe the hiring rates are well within the Barony's reach even if none is recouped by donation. (Recommend donation box at Stuff Nights to get help towards hall cost plus use of some funds to encourage the Arts by having a regular night in a public place, on bus routes).

Brief correspondence with Myrun regarding Wildmoor making Mouseguard pouches (encouraged strongly). Brief correspondence with Eva regarding possible A&S classes at Golden Flight.

Is resigning as having to move to Auckland.

CHRONICLER (Eva): Put FTT out late, other than that all has been quiet. Quarterly to follow.

WEBWRIGHT (Ginevra): Tidy up of incorrect forms for event stewards in Documents section.

I've continued working on keeping email lists spam free, actioned requests for changes to Stewarding, and paperwork sections of the site.

CHATELAINE (Philippe): Went to Wildmoor fighter training. Was a blast. Good fighting, though cold. Very successful trip. Correspondence with Quentin re meeting June 7 to review garb. No demos planned until Arms and Militaria (July 26). Trying to get more fighters interested for that. Heritage week coming up in the week up to Labour weekend.

QUARTERMASTER (Raffe): Correspondence with Lowrens re trailer sale. Collected trailer from West Melton, arranged WOF and transferred possession to new owner. Sourced 3 new shelving units for our lockup and will move and arrange next weekend (18th) with Lord Richard. Visited Sir Sigurd's and assisted in putting together 2 sets of

loaner armour to go to Wildmoor for Anzac weekend training. Ordered 1 new help from Ironmonger armoury for loaner gear. Arranged 2 free tables from Graeme @ antique arms faire (Riccarton Racecourse) and passed on details to Sir Philippe to coordinate. Retrieved 1 set of armour from Andy (Godric?) so still have 2 complete sets for Chch. Attended fighters practices.

Looking for interest from anyone interested in making sunshades - possibly 1 more for the Barony to replace damaged one (and/or one for yourselves) at Collegium).

CONSTABLE (Bjorn): No report recieved.

MARSHALL (Elena): No report.

CAPTAIN OF ARCHERS (Darayavaush): The last month has been quiet. Had one application for the Captain's position but have yet to hear back from kingdom about whether or not they got the email. Practices have been quiet and sporadic due to the weather. Otherwise not much has happened.

CAPTAIN OF RAPIER (Elena): No report recieved.

CHIRURGEON (Kotek): No report received.

EVENT REPORTS:

Past Events:

12th Night (Isabel Maria): working on info from reeve required to finish report. Waimakariri District Council unclear on booking/payment. Waiting on invoice.

Canterbury Faire (Maximilian and Antonia): Financial report presented, \$4678.48 profit. Things went smoothly at the event with the exception of meal plan issues (Original Meal Plan co-ordinator bailed at late notice, hard to find volunteers for cooking meals, long queue times at meals which could be improved by using baskets and serving cold lunches). Many thanks to Del and Sandra for saving the meal plan. Best win for least effort was the A&S workshop (in the marquee). Recommend further development of electronic booking and payment. Suggested having separate bank account for all CF stuff to allow easy identification of deposits and payments (agreed by Council, although we can use the existing "clearing"

account which hasn't had any activity for a long time).

Recommend serious look at moving the marquee further towards the war field and giving Ildhafn/Northside encampments more space to set up. The setup this year was very cramped and there was a marked amount of space to the right of the marquee that could be moved into. Varied opinions on this. If this is not done then Ildhafn will need to be moved but this is awkward for a number of reasons. (Council discussion indicated that the war field was already feeling cramped, particularly for combat archery). This topic would need further discussion, possibly within the context of wider changes).

We should buy fewer haybales. 30 is enough. If selling haybales to attendees make it an option on the booking form in future.

Upcoming Events:

Yule (Amalie): Is happening. 32 bookings so far.

Collegium (Richard): Change of date required due to large number of people away. Agreed to move to 19th-20th of July.

Wildmoor Fimbulwinter (Gheleyn): Budget looks ok following indications of interest by the populace. Event proposal accepted in principle.

Golden Flight: 2nd bid received from Eva, Darayavaush and Ceallach. Show weekend camping event (Fri-Sun) at Rimu Park. Robin Hood theme. Encourage newcomers with games and prizes. Quiz, archery, heavy and rapier tourneys. James of Southron Gaard has agreed to do breakfast. Pickup service will be offered from Hornby and/or Church Corner.

Bid from Myrun/Bjorn still in progress due to investigating alternate site (Omaka). Expect bid for next council meeting where a decision will be made.

AS 50 event (2016, Katherine): Proposal received from Mistress Katherine for SG to sponsor arranging for Known World Tapestry project to be brought to Rowany festival and then a Crescent Isles event. Various kingdom funds will be sought to cover the main costs, without which the proposal cannot proceed. Agreement in principle with the proposal. Katherine to begin discussions regarding securing kingdom funds and to begin seeking a venue in Chch for event here. Some discussion re

losing numbers for CF for this, however agreed that this would likely have minimal impact if at all.

GENERAL BUSINESS:

Application for Captain of Archers received.

Wildmoor (Catalina/Aimee) – extensive email re concerns and questions. Discussed with B&B. Responded regarding current group status (not an official group yet, working through stipulations set up by Barony to gain our sponsorship of their eventually official application), officer status (all “officers” are in fact deputies of SG officers). Offered advice regarding running the office of seneschal. No one laugh.

Quarterly Reports – Only one received so far (Chatelaine). All required by the 15th.

Activities

Fighter Training (Wildmoor). Sorted out loaner armour with Sigurd and Raffe. Drove down with Philippe and Callum on Anzac Weekend. 2 training sessions – Friday afternoon and most of Saturday. Potluck dinner at Myrun’s house. Great time. 4 new fighters with enthusiasm. Left loaner gear down there since it fitted. Will keep in touch with progress and see how it’s going for possible return at Fimbulwinter.

Projects

Storage – Visit to storage with Raffe postponed by a week. Will be this weekend.

Got email from Safestore with invoice. Asked them to update the contact details and Lowrens was able to send through paperwork to confirm change of responsibility.

Haven’t sent account application to Smiths Hire yet.

Combined Practices – Got response from Papanui High who aren’t keen on a permanent arrangement. Looking for alternatives. Emailed Max (A&S) regarding this and catching up to discuss plans. Haven’t managed to yet. Kirkwood school is an option. Raffe to contact Waimari School. Philippe to contact Redwood Scouts to see about the use of their hall.

Bad Debtors Policy – Found this on Kingdom Exchequer website. Seems fairly definitive on the matter:

Group can accrue bad debts from members of the populace either through promising to pay for events

before-hand and then not doing so or by paying with bad cheques. Where ever possible it is recommended that payments are made before the event, preferable by direct bank deposit. However despite this bad debts may still occur, so how should they be handled.

Groups can choose to write off the debts without perusing them, or follow them up individually, or keep a list of debtors and refuse those people credit for future events, as they see fit.

Groups may stop people attending an event if they haven't paid for that event. However, they may not stop people attending future events they have paid for because they haven't paid for past events.

Beyond the requirement for payment of relevant event fees, refusal of entry to events is under the control of the Crown and the relevant Board of Directors.

Discussion ensued particularly around the point of cutting off bookings and requiring payment prior to the event. Agreement that it seemed reasonable within the policy above to specify that the cut off date for payments can be prior to the event (eg when bookings close) thus any extension after that date (including up to the event date) can be considered "credit" and therefore refused to people that have demonstrated risk in the past.

Combat Archery: Darayavaush advises that online store in Australia is offering a bow, 12 arrows and maybe a quiver for A\$150. Darayavaush is talking to armourers re combat archery gear.

Facebook: Currently there are Facebook groups for Wildmoor, A&S and Rapier. Would be nice to advertise the existence of these as they may not be well known. Also must ensure that any announcements are made on email lists as well. Discussed general Barony presence on Facebook. Some strong views that we should have a Facebook page. Equally strong concerns that inappropriate behaviour on Facebook can get very nasty and has demonstrably caused problems for SCA groups in the past. While this can be monitored and controlled somewhat (groups admins such as seneschal and webwright could take down posts) such action must be considered carefully. Suggested that a "business" style Facebook page be created, which does not allow non-admins to start new conversations, but non-admins can comment. Need to discuss further with webwright and review SCA social media policy.

Events

Collegium – See event reports

Fimbulwinter – Event proposal received from Gheleyn. Advised canvassing people to see what sort of numbers we can expect. Bid and budget to present in Events. Sought and recieved advice re supply of alcohol at an event – can’t do anything through the group that involves selling, supplying alcohol directly or indirectly (eg by paying for brewing supplies). Investigated transport options - \$20 return with Naked Bus, including 20kg of luggage.

November Event – Continued discussions with Myrun. Tried to do a drive by of Omaka to see what state the facilities are in, but gate was locked.

On the positive side – the gate looked to be in good condition ?

Canterbury Faire 2015 – request for bids sent out. Nothing so far.

Baronial Anniversary 2015 – now accepting bids. AS 50 Event (Katherine Kerr) – See event reports.

Other News

Official Events – reminder about “official” events. If it looks like a duck and quacks like a duck, it’s a duck. You can’t get around the rules by saying it’s not an official event.

SCA (NZ) Inc. Membership
