Saturnalia

The Saturnalia was celebrated in Ancient Rome, originally on the 17th of December (by the Julian calendar) but became so popular it was eventually extended thought to the 23rd, the festivities lasting a whole week. The poet Catallus described it as "the best of days", and it was a time of celebration, spending time with friends, and exchanging gifts.

This important holy day was to honour the god of sowing, Saturn, and included a festival day on which there was a sacrifice at the Temple of Saturn, and thereafter, a public banquet was served.

A member of the family was appointed *Saturnalicus princeps* (basically the lord of misrule) and was responsible for arranging the festivities. A carnival-like atmosphere descended, citizens were permitted leisure time and gambling was allowed. In a brief role-reversal, masters served food to their slaves.

Gifts were exchanged, and as gifts of value would be a marker of social status contrary to the spirit of the season, these were typically small or 'gag' gifts, typically small earthenware figurines and wax candles but Martial records in his poems on the Saturnalia items such as writing tablets, combs, toothpicks, knucklebones, dice, balls, cups, spoons items of clothing and moneyboxes. Now *there's* some inspiration for your gifting this season. 😊

A Great Hunt for Canterbury Faire.

Let all who would travel to Canterbury Faire next know that on the **22**nd day of January being a Tuesday there will be a Very Great Hunt in honour of Saint Eustace.

And that said Hunt will require the Gathering of Hunt Parties Hounds on the aforesaid Tuesday at 9 of the bell sharp and ante meridian, in the environs of the Great Hall where the Huntmasters will inspect and record the said parties that are to quest forth providing all who gather with a stirrup cup and a copy of the Book of the Hunt that they may travel on their quest. And all that who come should bring thither all that they need every one in their role well and plenteously and that these parties should include those who wish to take up the many diverse challenges as modelled after ancient custom. Thus each party should have,



- two combatants in suitable gear and with rebated weapons ready to take up Challenges of the Field Fencing Grounds and the Fearsome Beasts to be found within
- one or two archers with a set of no more than six target arrows and likewise a set of six blunted arrows held separately so they may participate in the Bow Challenge
- at least one Hound being a sturdy child of seven to fourteen years hound packs are to be welcomed but must be under the active supervision of an Houndsmaster
- as many hunt followers or banner bearers or beaters or gamesfolk as be enow, bearing in mind that some challenges will require artisanal or scholarly skills or both



To make this better known the Huntmasters ask that these words be carried far wide so that the aforementioned parties may arrange themselves before Faire if of a mind to do so and present themselves in good time on the cited day. For there shall be Certain Advantages in being first to do so. And certain advantages in honouring the Beasts of the field forest in one's gear garb gauds. And certain advantages in the knowledge of Venerie.

And at this Hunt there will be Noble Rich Prizes to be presented at the Mencee.

Meeting Minutes, Wed 14th Nov 2018.

Meeting start 7:38pm

Elena: Move to hold on the previous minute's meetings until next meeting

Godric: Seconds

Objections- the past meeting's minutes include the bank signatory part

Elena- that's where it gets tricky, yes it does. We can hold the officer's reports until next meeting.

Against: No-one

FAT funding application: Edith: we get wood carving knives/tools for use by the general populace instead of using artisan's own tools.

Discussion- have you asked the artisan's if they mind? No though haven't been to previous CF.

Am asking for a good chunk of the FAT

Elena- do you have a list of tools, and cost?

Edith- refer to application form. 30 pounds each. A chest to store them in- Sir Callum has offered to make.

Need leather for the sheaths. 1 sq foot by 1 sq foot (6 sq feet) in all. Minimum order of 27 a side.

Could come back for funding

Richard- Bjorn may still have leather that could be used.

James- Quantities seem a bit odd. 1 sq foot seems too big

Edith- I'm sure he said 1 sq foot. The knives are a compound curve so its not just a straight blade. We can put this off til next month

Elena: I like that the application seems well thought out and noted down.

Richard: are their other sources other than Hugh

Edith: not really and not cheaper

Elena: is there a link to the site?

Max: I like the proposal, Could get another source for the leather. Would prefer to defer til next month.

Elena: can hold off til next council

Agnes: all for waiting til next council meeting.

Edith: is your concern about using one source?

Elena: don't know enough about sources. Should we order 1 of everything now and order more later?

Edith: I'm worried we'll need multiple packages. Will be 22 pounds.

Richard: is it air freighted?

Elena: order everything now or hold until next month though it may miss Faire. Could do a partial order?

Ginevra: seems like everyone is in favour except suppliers. We could get the financial committee to approve.

Elena: If financial committee can do it, it would be great.

Edith: postal dates may be a issue. We've missed the 28th of September date. Last international date 10th Dec

Elena: and what about GST

Richard: and/or duty

Elena: unsure of totals then

James: the new financial rules take place next year.

Elena: is it worth doing two separate orders and pay

Richard: lets defer to the financial committee and not decide tonight.

Elena: I move to pass this to the financial committee.

Max seconds. I approve in general and want at least two quotes as significant amount.

Elena: I approve in principle, subject to the financial committee.

Vote: Any nays?

Abstentions: Godric

8 nays. Motion passed

Funding Request:

Knives- \$200 and \$200 for tea towels.

Feedback:

Agnes: I'm in favour of proposal as I would use it

Kotek: Good for various sites

Max: In favour

Ginervra: in favour of tea towels

James: move to accept the proposal

Ginervra: second the motion

All in favour.

Funding Request: Ready to Arm

Fiora: Request: \$100 to run project Ready To Arm again this Canterbury Faire. The funds will go towards printing costs for the heraldic trading cards. As I've been off work the last four months, I have a large number of devices conflict-checked and ready to go.

The project had a great response from the populace this year, generating a huge number of heraldic submissions. Some of the remaining devices were taken by people in other Kingdoms after the pictures showed up on social media. Other groups are now making their own cards William Castille (creator of the Lochac Roll of Arms) has expressed interest in an online version of the project."

Elena: Great that it's being picked up by the Kingdom and put online.

Richard: Move to accept.

Godric: I second

All in favour.

Agnes: I think this is a wonderful thing.

Agnes: The Cross and Raven are not willing to do it again.

Ginevra: There is someone in mind.

Elena: site booked and paid for. Event is half full.

Faire Update:

Ginervra: Apologies for slackness. Over 200 have book. Feast bookings have closed, so now wait listed.

Officer Reports:

B&B: Richard: went to Hororata, handed out flyers.

Ginervra: held a court in Wildmoor, presented Edith with Order of the Tourdor, attended dance and had discussions with lots of people about C.F, B.A, and coronation.

Seneschal report: went to Wildmoor, attended practices. Officer catch up with the Knight Marshall, Reeve. Organise library bookings for next years council meetings. Discussed with Jayne about

continuing the current role as minute taker. Communications with officers about reports. Found out that Kingdom levy for events not applicable for Faire.
