The Barn Find

A surprising number of Japanese garments turn up in op shops, antique stores and on occasion in estate sales. To cap it off many garments from Japan are not actually that expensive they just never seem to be in our size....except they are provided the garment is made following the rules, if the garment is made exactly how it should be made all that material you need to make it your size is hidden in there. To prove my point, today I am going to take a piece I have never needed to deconstruct before as I fit it when it arrived and photograph it's fit on me now, then deconstruct with careful photo's and reassemble to the correct size for my current body.

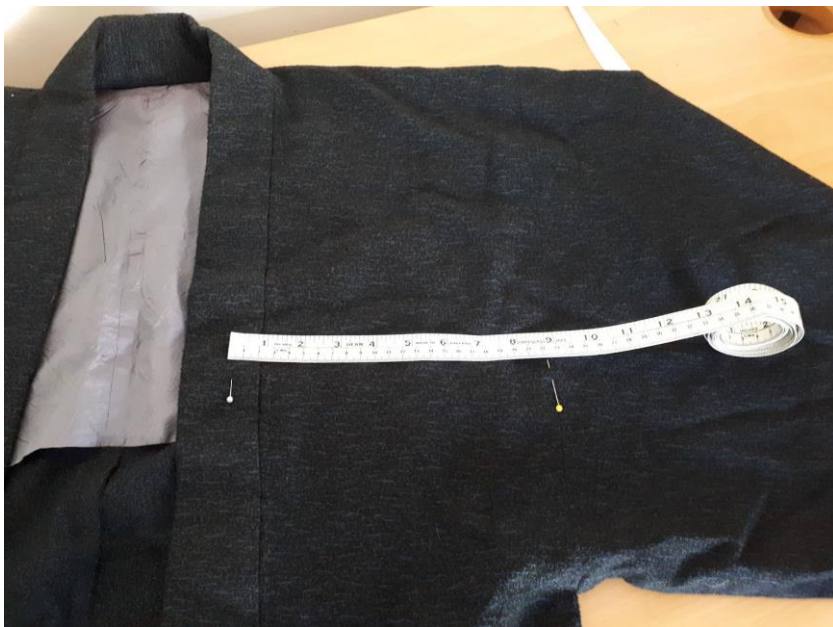


It doesn't seem too far off but in accordance with correct sizing the sleeve needs to gain some to reach my wrist, i need to lower the hem line to be more effective as the windbreak coat that it's supposed to be and lastly bring the collar that runs down the side closer together so it looks straight down at the front instead of that slight bowing.

'But Tatsu!' I hear you say, 'how big is the biggest size I can get out one even if I take it right to the edge?' Well around the upper chest (over Bust) with 14 inches salvage to salvage we can't go past 55 inches, 56 inches less seam allowance...but below the bust we can go as large as a 64 inch waist for an over jacket (Kosode and Haori) and as far as a 80 inch waist for a Kimono. If you can't find the fabric in there for your frame either the person making the

garment broke with tradition and removed fabric from the edge or it might be time to consider moving to the 28 inch wide fabric and living it up like a Shogun!

I measure the front panel as it is showing, in a western garment at 9 inches wide showing on the outside I could only reasonably expect to get another Half inch if I am very very lucky and run my seams right to the edge, but on a Japanese garment unless I am exceptionally *unlucky* there should be another 5 inches in there just waiting for me to unpick and find them.



I get my little Kiaken (utility knife) that I finished a day or so ago, its supposedly ideal for the deconstruction of this garment...which about half an hour in I fully understand why. That might be something you have to experience for yourself to understand.



So I start by removing the collar, if this garment really is a traditional one then first this won't take long as it is hand tacked on...and it...IS! yay!

I then unfold it to see how they compact it, if the full width of material is in there and to see if they have hidden any spare panels or parts inside.



It is 14 inches just like it should be and there are no spare panels hidden inside.

I then lay the jacket back out to see if I can find the extra body fabric on the outside edge of the collar area, I mean that would save me a day of hand sewing and measuring....no such luck, they extracted the side gore from the front collar...going to have to dive deeper. This marks this garment out as a 'modern' interpretation of a very traditional garment, it's logical allowing for smoother lines and so on but it's not period to 1600 or before. Still....if that is the ONLY moment they depart then this is a really good one and a worthy example to follow with only that concession to be corrected in a new garment. I talked about it last time...'don't cut sections out of your panels, you may make slits and turn it back.'



See here? The panel is not turned back like it should be, just cut off...but I would find what they did with the material later..

I laid the body out and drew around the side gores in white tailors chalk, otherwise you would struggle to see them and this is how much material has been folded back into that hem line, so you can clearly see that even if you are quite a bit taller than I am there is room to unfold it and make it longer too. In fact I might have to as I would like to more thoroughly cover the holes in the sides of my Hakama on the cold days I need this Jacket.





Next I removed the sleeves and with the seam allowance unfolded there is about an inch of fabric that can be extracted to add to my arm length but it's not enough to make it correct, so some will have to come from body width expansion. It's still 14 inches wide in the sleeve though! As far as period correctness goes, still on track for pre 1600

When I open the sleeves right up I find the other piece from the other front panel...it was being used as a way to neaten the sleeve openings.



I then take the lining material out of the body, it's only tacked in with hand stitching and comes away, if I want to replace it to the new size I will need to cut a new one. It is the easiest to replace, doesn't take a lot of fabric and it might be nice to use something a bit less restrained to give the inside of my garment some wow factor when I take it off...damn those sumptuary laws to hell. For Japan they started in the 11th century concerning the types of fabric used and by the 1600's the laws had become very complicated. Socially Merchants and above could afford the good stuff but didn't dare show it on the outside so they decorated the inside of their clothing elaborately. Even today you can find restrained quality kimono that have the most dazzling patterns in the lining.



So I have ironed out all the pieces and laid them out flat for you to see, this is the state they would be in for washing too, so it is actually a good chance for me to do that.

I turn the edges of all the lengths over and tack them down before going to the washing tub and giving them a hand wash. I will then put them on the clothes rack to dry and then iron them flat again ready to be put back together in my size.

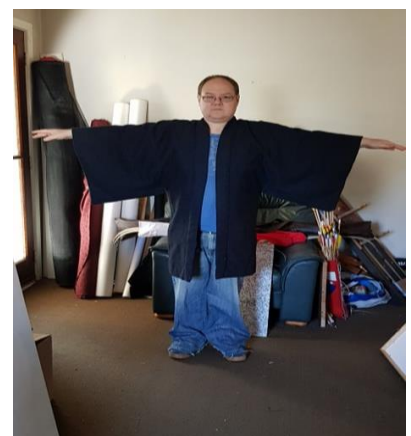
Oh wait! I need to find some razzle dazzle to line the inside with....must have something lying around here somewhere....

As you can see all the pieces can come off a long roll only 14 inches wide, it allows a person to work and make quality garments in quite a small space. And as you can see with the exception of easing in the neck, all cuts are across the fabric, not down the sides.

I cut new panels of shiny interior heavy Satin from an old stash of 'I will do something with that someday' fabric. Each internal panel is cut to the same size as the exterior with a few exceptions, the hem of each panel is set to the turn up to keep the thickness out.



With new shiny lining fabric cut and sewn in and the width reset to me (for now) the finished garment is now ready for my current needs.

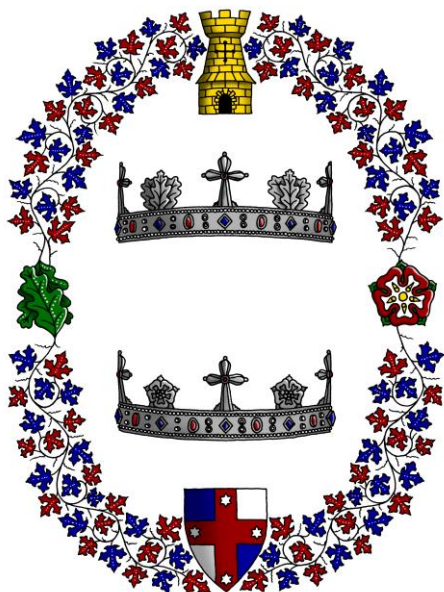

Officer Vacancy: Reeve

Role

Record the financial information of the Barony and report to Kingdom.

Requires

- Current SCA membership
- Basic accounting knowledge
- Clean credit record (so you can be a signatory on the cheque account)

Workload

Varies, most of the year, very little, but during and just after major events, the workload will increase. Also regular attendance at and/or reporting to Council meeting.

Reporting Channel

Quarterly to Kingdom Exchequer and monthly to Council

Resources

Outgoing Reeve (for a while)

Kingdom Exchequer

Note: an applicant for the position of Reeve in NZ must be approved by the SCA NZ Committee, in addition to the normal officer appointment process.

Note: Reeve is a required role for the Barony. No Reeve, no Barony.

Applications are sought immediately to allow for a short crossover period for training.



Chatelaine (aka Hospitaller)

Role: The Chatelaine/Hospitaller is responsible for the encouragement and empowerment of newcomers in the group. This involves both actively chatting to interested people at musters and other public events, and fielding enquiries about the group from the Southron Gaard website, from which the Chatelaine's email is linked.

The Chatelaine is also responsible for the housing and administration of the Baronial Hire Garb, though this may be delegated to a deputy. This involves loaning hire garb to newcomers and encouraging them to acquire or make their own clothing.

Requires: Current SCA membership

A sunny disposition, a positive outlook about the group, a willingness to chat to strangers.

Workload: Can be high immediately prior to an event, often with last-minute requests for hire garb. This can be managed by posting reminders about hire garb cut-off dates to the SG lists.

The public workload involves being chatty and convivial to newcomers at events, checking they are comfortable, finding out about their particular interests, giving them leaflets and/or introduction cards and introducing them to other members of the group, etc. *Note: it is recommended that the Chatelaine's full contact details be on all leaflets handed out; this may mean hand-writing it in on pre-printed blanks.*

At Musters the workload can be quite high and involve many repetitive discussions with interested onlookers. One of the best ways to minimise the workload at musters is to appoint three or four assistants on the day to help.

Reporting Channel The Chatelaine is a deputy to the Seneschal and reports to the Barony monthly at Council and/or via a written report. Quarterly reports are made to the Kingdom Hospitality Minister and cc-ed to the Seneschal and B&B.

Quartermaster

Role: Store and keep track of Baronial equipment

Workload:

- Ensure clean and secure storage of the Baronial equipment.
- Maintain lines of communication with event stewards/cooks regarding required equipment for events, and arrange pick up/drop off.
- Maintain the Baronial Inventory, and check off returned equipment.
- Report to Council regarding status of equipment, including loss, damage, replacement or new equipment required

Requires

Accessible, weatherproof and lockable storage space approximately the size of a standard car. If transporting gear to an event, a vehicle with a tow bar/ball joint is required.

Resources

Gear is stored at Mandeville (Raffe and Melisande's property) and also at the CF site, in containers.

A&S Officer

The A&S Officer is tasked with encouraging the arts and sciences in the Barony through classes, workshops, informal gatherings and competitions.

Requires

- Current SCA membership
- Be warranted (2 years, 4 max under exceptional circumstances – this is handled by your Kingdom officer when you take on the office)
- Membership in the A&S officers email list, if you have email. Workload
- Encourage and organize A&S workshops and competitions in the Barony.
- Get reports from workshops and events in the Barony that hold an A&S competition (for quarterly reporting purposes).
- Send quarterly reports to Kingdom A&S Minister.
- Promulgate and support group and individual projects related to your office in so far as you are able.
- Encourage and support arts activities both at and outside of events
- Run (or organize someone to run) the Kingdom Arts and Sciences competitions _if_ the Kingdom Coronation or Crown Tourney is being held by the Barony _and_ the Kingdom A&S Minister cannot attend the event.

Reporting Channel The A&S Officer is required to report to the Kingdom A&S Minister quarterly. Copies of these reports are sent to the Baronial Seneschal and the Baron & Baroness.
