## Their Excellencies Speak

To the populace of Southron Gaard,

Lords, Ladies, Gentles all, do Oswyn and Isabel Maria send greetings. We hope this letter finds you well.

First of all, thanks to the volunteers for the Antique Arms Faire show! We should have very much liked to attend, but were away for some days in the farther south at what might with reservations be called Victorian-coloured event. It took place at a great house rather ambitiously called a Castle. While such a title may lead to disappointment in those who were expecting to be greeted by great walls and moats rather than sunrooms and a gift store, it would still make a fine venue for an event. The view from the 'tower' was most pleasing. I do recall there having been at least one battle on its front lawn, but there was the enticement for the owners of their home being displayed on television. I am also unsure how they would feel about a protracted war or tournament in which heavily encumbered fighters stripped the earth of grass. The scout camp venue used for the Wildmoor dinner a few weeks ago sported many football fields, so I imagine the owners would be somewhat more forgiving in this respect.

Speaking of venues, we have been given to understand that Southron Gaard will soon be losing the use of Showbiz as a repository for Baronial property. Storage has been found, albeit rather less central than this last. Lord Raffe may be desirous of volunteers to assist with the transport of items to the new venue: we are sure he will let us know if and when this is the case. Please consider answering this call, as it must be done.

We thank him and Lady Melisande again for the use of Showbiz not only for storage but as a venue for practices and events. It has saved the Barony a fortune and much inconvenience.

We also wish to add our voices to that of the Seneschal regarding the call for officers. I believe we have a Lists officer who is only waiting for the word from Kingdom, and we have a kind volunteer for Chronicler. We do not believe we have had biters for Webwright or Quartermaster. We need someone for both these roles, but one for Quartermaster with a modicum of urgency, as stuff needs to get to and from site, and needs to be accounted for. Whether the QM does this themselves, or ensures it happens via clear and documented delegation, we do not mind. But it must happen. While it is reasonable to assume that these things will get done by someone because they must, we need a volunteer to be that someone. There being no someone decided upon beforehand has much to do with how things get lost. And while what we have wouldn't go far on Antiques Roadshow, it's still very important to the group.

Having thus poked, prodded and exhorted, we shall finish this column.

Many thanks in advance for those of you surely rushing to answer the call.

## Seneschal's Comments

Currently, the Barony has about fifteen officers, each with a two year term. Hence, an office changes hands about every other month, on average.

Earlier this year, the Chronicler and the Webwright positions were passed into new hands. However, real life intervened, and both these people have had to step away from these positions, hence more vacancies.

Elsewhere in this newsletter, you will see an advertisement for Webwright. Please consider applying for this. It doesn't require high tech skills, but keeping our email lists clear and keeping the website live and interesting is an important role.

There is also an advertisement for Quartermaster. It's an interesting time to be QM. As you will have read elsewhere, we are being cast out from our cosy storage place at Showbiz, in central Christchurch, as a result of the redevelopment work. However, by the time you read this, we should have a new storage place in Belfast, at a commercial store, and have moved some or all of our kit there. It's a pain to be paying money for this, but it could be worse.

Another part of the Baronial equipment thing is that we need to be considering what to do with the trailer. At the moment it needs a few small repairs to deal with some scrapes, to keep it weather tight and nice. However, whatever its other good

features, the trailer seems more awkward to tow than could be expected, which requires a heavier vehicle than otherwise, and limits the number of us who can safely tow it with our cars. Also, there is some concern that we may be loading it more than is advisable, given its relatively lightweight construction. So far, we have not had any bad experiences (that I know of), but this could all change suddenly if something breaks. The plan is to get an expert opinion about this, which should give us a basis for a sensible decision.

So, if the Webwright position is not your strength, perhaps you could consider the QM position instead. If you have any enquiries about this, please let me know, of course.

**PREVIOUS MINUTES:** No discussion. Carried and accepted.

## OFFICER REPORTS:

**B&B** (Oswyn and Isabel Maria): Correspondence with Lowrens re SG Chronicler and SG Webwright officers; with Mýrún & Lowrens re Wildmoor encampment; with Christian re demo opportunity (meeting to be scheduled); with (verbal) Isolde re possibility of SG & Lochac banner workshops; with (verbal) Callum re possibility of personal banner painting workshops. Events attended: Wildmoor winter encampment; Viking class.

**SENECHAL** (Lowrens): Correspondence with: Webwright and past Webwright re site maintenance; with SCANZ committee re property insurance; with SCANZ committee, UCMRS president and B&B re Steel Embassy at next CF; with Isolde about A&S matters; with Reeve and Mýrún about payments for Midwinter event; with Raffie about Antique Arms demo; with SG Discuss and several respondents re property insurance; with Eva re FTT material. Attended Callum's shoemaking talk in the Viking series.

**REEVE** (Mahasti): The reeving this month has been full of typing. I have liaised with the Kingdom Exchequer and her deputy Mýrún. June saw me emailing the SCANZ Council. Many things have been discussed, including PayPal and the past Domesday report. The issue of electronic

payment remains open for SCANZ, though not for CF this year.

I have spoken with Westpac to restore our account settings. I found that Raffie and Ed were still on the account and either we should change that to Antonia and Max or remove these completely. Financial P&L for June was \$100.15 in, \$655.71 out (mostly follow up to BA), net outgoing of \$555.56. Net worth is \$27003.93 assets less \$913 liabilities leaves \$26090.93.

**HERALD** (Lucia): Nothing to report.

**ARTS AND SCIENCES** (Isolde): The Viking project has mostly come to completion with Sir Callum presenting on shoe making 2 weeks ago. Lord James has encouraged individuals to meet at the university venue to continue completion of Viking project. There was a positive response to the suggestion of a Viking event, which would encourage finishing of garments/provide an opportunity to wear etc; this event yet to be confirmed but a possible date of late August was seen to be ideal.

Scriptorium continues twice monthly as per the SG calendar.

An A & S Collegium has been proposed by Lady Elisabetta and Lord Raffie. Date and venue yet to be confirmed. Option of two venues potentially available. Sir Callum is keen to run a shoe making class at this collegium. Meistren Christian is working on a Mongolian class for the event.

A & S activity proposed this month is to meet at The Make Cafe twice in July to work on projects.

Lady Christine to confirm a further sewing weekend in September.

Discussion with Canterbury Faire steward re: organising A & S calendar early to facilitate other aspects of CF planning to run smoothly.

**CHRONICLER** (Eva Interim): Got first issue of FTT out on the 1st of the month. Was nervous at first but overall, felt it went pretty well for a first attempt. I have decided to apply to take over the position of baronial chronicler. I was in contact



with the Lowrens and Mýrún over the course of the month for help.

**WEBWRIGHT** (Eleanora outgoing/Adam incoming): Nothing heard.

**CHATELAINE** (Quentin): Attended the Bloth in Auckland. Did not get stolen by Ildhafn. Attended Midwinter Camp in Dunedin. It was a good event and the site would definitely be good for a very large event. It's not far out of Dunedin, either. Hired some garb out for the Midwinter Camp.

Most of the remaining garb from CF was returned. Working on a bid for Golden Flight IV. Will have it in either next council or the one after.

**QUARTERMASTER** (Vacant): Re-advertised position in FTT - no responses as yet.

**CONSTABLE** (Bjorn): Nothing to report.

**MARSHALL** (Callum): Armour repair workshops are happening at Sigurd's. Otherwise quiet.

**CAPTAIN OF ARCHERS** (Darayavaush): Correspondence with the Chronicler with content for July FTT. No archery practices in the last month due to weather and Kirkwood Intermediate closing their field. Looking at some alternative locations for archery practice and events.

**CAPTAIN OF RAPIER** (Elena): Practices are happening, usually on the tennis court rather than the grass.

**CHIRURGEON** (Kotek): Offered the new Kingdom officer help if she needs it. Otherwise zip.  
Unless you count working 7 or 8 ambulance shifts?

### **Recent Events:**

**Antonio Hall/Sensory Experience:** It happened. Five people attended. Singing and mulled wine happened. A couple of sound clips are on the SG website.

**Midwinter Encampment:** Mýrún reports "The Midwinter camp event went well, everyone

appeared to enjoy themselves and there were no problems or issues to report. I will report that the kitchen at the venue was the nicest I've yet used at a SCA event. I haven't yet received all incoming monies for the event so will look to have the event report to you prior to the meeting in August."

**Antique Arms Demo 27th July:** Raffe has wangled a free couple of tables for us. Seeking volunteers to man these.

**CF2014:** Antonia reported several things on the go.

\* Mýrún has proposed "chores for cash" fundraising for a new group. Antonia was concerned that any fundraising they do is worth their while. Raised the possibility of matching funds and/or gifts for the new group in addition to what they get by their own efforts. Assuming that the group looks solid, a financial boost would really help them, and a fat purse and a pile of gifts at closing CF court would be great shtick as well. For later.

\* SCANZ Treasurer is still looking at foreign currency payment options; proposing to form a committee to consider this. Mahasti noted that credit card payment will not be an option for 2014.

\* Booking website - considered Ildhafn's server but no real advantage over current arrangements. Will be going back to Bartholomew to update the usual website.

\* Meal plan: How to arrange this so that it is not a full time job for someone. Will be proposing complimentary pass for meal plan organiser, since this is a lot of work. Considering if there can be some day-to-day support to ease the load.

**Mediaeval Fair activity in Christchurch:** Isabel Maria reported an update from Christien that

SCA's role might be best as "local colour" in the spectators, rather than directly in a performance.

**Banner Workshop:** Callum offered the use of his classroom/workshop for a banner making workshop. There will be canvas, paint, and brushes available. Will be second week of the school holidays, Callum to advertise time and date and place on Discuss.

### GENERAL BUSINESS:

**Insurance:** have some details from Vitale about the pavilion; some Trade Me numbers for the trailer; others still to come. Darayavaush suggested \$2000 as a valuation for the Baronial Archery gear.

## Quartermaster Wanted

### VACANCY - WE NEED A NEW QUARTERMASTER

Now that Lord Angus has served his term, and more, this office of the Barony stands empty.

The duties of the Quartermaster are:

- \* To manage the storage and to keep track of Baronial equipment,
- \* To ensure clean and secure storage of the Baronial equipment,
- \* Communicate with event stewards/cooks regarding required equipment for events, and arrange pick up/drop off,
- \* To maintain the Baronial Inventory, and check off returned equipment,
- \* Report to Council regarding status of equipment, including loss, damage, replacement or new equipment required.

The quartermaster is a deputy to the Seneschal and reports to him/her as well as the Council.

The amount of Baronial gear is currently beyond the scope of most of us being able to provide our own storage space (about a single-car garage space). At present, the Barony has access to free lockable storage in central Christchurch, thanks to connections at Showbiz.

Because of other things going on in central Christchurch, Showbiz have to move out later this year, and therefore so do we. We are resigned to having to pay for commercial storage for a while until we find a new home for our stuff.

This is all by way of saying that you don't personally have to provide storage to be the QM - it's about keeping tabs on what we have and who needs it, and when.
