The level or kinds of A&S and martial activity in the Barony. Or your views on the frequency and type of events or other activities you'd like to see happening.

Every opinion and idea will be given due weight although, realistically, suggestions accompanied by "and I'd like to help make this happen" are much more likely to come to fruition!

Regardless, please do make the effort to provide feedback during the survey period. After all, this is your Barony.


or have your courier, pack- train or sloop-of-war deliver them to the Hermitage or, failing that, to the event not less than 30 minutes before lists close.

# Cordials and the making thereof

Herbal Cordial, loosely based on 1596 recipe "To make Rosemary water" and 1609 recipe "Spirits of wine tasting of what vegetable you please"

½ tsp. packed fresh rosemary leaves  
½ tsp. packed fresh sage leaves  
3 T. packed fresh lemon balm leaves  
1-1/2 cups 80-proof brandy  
simple syrup: 2 c. white granulated sugar to 1 c. water

Rosemary (*Rosmarinus officinalis*) was said to clear the head and improve memory. Lemon Balm (*Melissa officinalis*) was said to cause "the mind and hearth to become merry and reviveth the heart". Sage (*Salvia officinalis*) supposedly also helped the memory and quickened the senses. (All remarks from Nicholas Culpeper, *Culpeper's Complete Herbal*, cited by Jennifer Heise/Jadwiga Zajackowa in [Jadwiga's Stillroom Book: On the Medieval and Renaissance Use of Herbs](#).)

The fresh herbs were bruised with a mortar and pestle and then put in a glass jar and covered with brandy, then left for 1-1/2 weeks but stirred each day. The solid material was strained out and squeezed through cheesecloth and the liquid then poured through unbleached coffee filters. A simple sugar syrup was then added to the proportions of 1 cup of syrup to 2 cups of liquor. This turned out rather sharp, even with the same proportion of sugar syrup I've used in the other cordials. Perhaps best be viewed (and tasted) as a medicinal tonic rather than as a drink for pure enjoyment.

Morello Cherry Cordial, loosely based on 1655 (?) recipe of "A cordial Cherry-water"

1 quart of 80-proof brandy, or 2 cups brandy and 2 cups grappa  
12 oz. jar of morello cherries, drained  
8 ounces white granulated sugar (approx. 1-1/8 c.)  
1-1/2 tsp. anise seeds, bruised with mortar and pestle

The ingredients are those of the original recipe but with many more cherries and minus the cinnamon and cloves. The ingredients were combined in a glass jar and left for 15 days with occasional stirring. The solid material was strained out using a fine nylon coffee filter and then doubled unbleached paper coffee filters. The result is an excellent balance of sweetened sour cherry flavor complemented by a touch of anise.

## Pomegranate Cordial

1 quart of 80-proof brandy, or 2 cups brandy and 2 cups grappa  
2 large pomegranate, the seeds and pulp only (all white membrane removed), approximately 3 cups  
8 ounces white granulated sugar (approx. 1-1/8 c.)

The pomegranate seeds/pulp were crushed lightly with the back of a large spoon to release more of the juices. They were then combined with the sugar and brandy in a glass jar and left for 7 days with occasional stirring. The solid material was strained out first with a fine nylon coffee filter and after with doubled unbleached paper coffee filters. The result is a beautiful pink-red cordial with a nicely not-too-sweet flavor.

Lemon Orange, based on 1594 recipe of "How to give a prettie grace both in tast and propertie, unto the spirit of wine"

2 tsp. grated lemon peel from 2 lemons  
1-1/2 tsp. grated orange peel from 1 orange  
2-3/4 cups 80-proof brandy  
1-1/4 cups 100-proof grappa  
1-1/2 cups simple syrup: 2 c. granulated sugar (1 c. white, 1 c. raw) to 1 c. water

The orange and lemons were grated carefully so that no white pith was used (it makes the flavor bitter) and the peel was added to the brandy and left for three days, being stirred occasionally. The liquid was then filtered with a nylon coffee filter and the sugar syrup added and dissolved, then and strained again with doubled unbleached paper filters. The result was a good mix of lemon and orange flavor, though the proportions can probably be played with without much harm.



SENECHAL:

- Been away on holiday most of the month

Most of the money in this month is from CF. At one point during last month we went into overdraft in the cheque account, this is due to the huge number of cheques going out after last council meeting, this has now been fixed by the transfer of the BA, Yule and Fete monies now having been transferred. About a month or so ago, the FC asked me to investigate the rate at which stewards should be reimbursed for petrol whilst on event business. The IRD's recommended rate for business is a flat rate of 28 cent per kilometre or 62 cents per kilometre for the first 3000km's and 19 cents per kilometre thereafter. I would recommend the flat rate, much easier to work out, plus there aren't that many events where a steward would travel over 3000 km. If the council wishes to pursue petrol allowances for stewards, then I will need to get a vehicle log book for stewards to fill in when they are on event business.

BARONIAL ANNIVERSARY

- Still no bids received for this event. Seneschal to push for bids on discussion list.
- Reminder that the event can be quite low key.

GENERAL BUSINESS:

JADE STADIUM DISPLAY:

- Invited to attend one of our fighter's practices. Waiting for reply.

KITCHEN/QUARTERMASTER GEAR PROPOSAL:

Adele presented a proposed list of equipment to buy for the Baronial kitchen supplies. Some of this is to replace lost/broken gear, the rest is new stuff we desperately need. Adele proposed a shortened list of priority items we need for CF, along with pricing for the items. The Warehouse prices were considerably cheaper than Southern Hospitality.

The priority list came to ~ \$500.

It was decided that due to the increasing size of our event (CF, coronation etc), that it would be a good idea to get these items, as well as some storage containers to keep them in.

Veronica also suggested the purchasing of some extra items to make it easier for first time cooks (chef's knives, more pots etc). This will be followed up on later, as not urgently needed for CF.

Veronica also suggested the purchasing of a large wardrobe unit for the Quartermaster to keep the baronial gear in. Comments that Bunnings was currently selling cheap ones. Seneschal to investigate.

SILVER PLATTERS: Proposal to send 5 of the silver platters each to the Canton and the College. All agreed,

SUPER BOFFER:

- Proposal to gift 2 of the super boffer swords to St Kessog. All agreed.
- Commission Dieter to make 2 more hilts. All agreed.

- Clarification that petrol money can be included in an event bid budget.

The baronial trailer is currently on its way down to Christchurch. Should arrive in the next few days. Trailer committee will get together and inspect it and decide if any work needs doing. Will need to be painted at some point.

Reverse

This is a coin of Toulouse, minted during 13th century under the authority of Raymond VII. The legend on the obverse states RAMON COMES (Count Raymond) and surrounds a short cross with a small S in one corner. The reverse states + TOLOSA CIVI (City of Toulouse) and surrounds an unusual monogram. It is most likely a symbol of heraldry.
