An excellent range of smaller events is the dominant theme at present. Following on from the well-received Spring Collegium, we travelled south to attend a fine repast in Castelburn, which included a play, dancing, song and an interesting presentation on medieval diet.

Katherine then found time to escape for a stargazing event hosted by the Canton of Stowe-on-the-Wold, at what will become the new Festival site. This turned out to be as green as promised, in a very deep, quiet valley, offering quite a change of scene from the previous venue.

The mini-ball at the end of October marked the departure of the newly recognised Lord Merlin of Southron Gaard from our desmene, though many will hope to see him at Canterbury Faire and other events in future.

Ahead lies Emilio's Ambassador's Ball, which offers an opportunity for amusing persona interactions in the context of a grand ball -- there are several Tuesday workshops scheduled for learning or polishing some of the dances for this, and Emilio notes that the Ball provides several opportunities for taking on parts of the Renaissance Challenge.

Early December will see the Halfla revel which Lord Daid promises will be a rather different kind of event, with another fine repast prepared by Lord Kotek.

Then the preparations for Canterbury Faire will start in earnest with a site preparation picnic at the site on December 22nd, open to all who can attend and help out. Bookings for the Faire are already running strongly, with both new and familiar faces from within without the Barony.

Our thanks and congratulations to the stewards and helpers for all these events -- your vision and efforts enrich us all. And for those who are not involved in running these events, if you offer to help -- particularly for Canterbury Faire -- you will likely find yourself dealing with a very grateful steward!

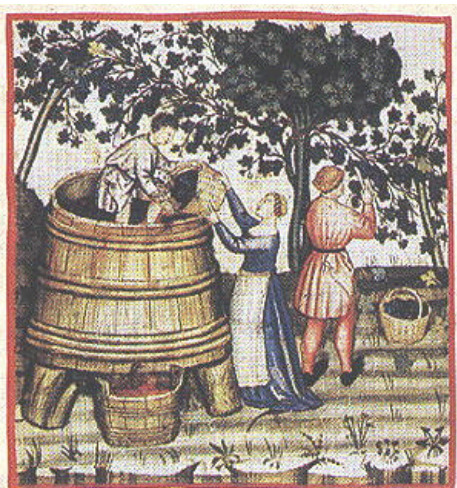

Southron Gaard Renaissance Challenge

Whereas it is the firmly-held view of the Baron and Baroness of Southron Gaard that the people of these lands have for long been second-to-none in the Kingdom in the accomplishment of the various arts, crafts, sciences, martial displays and service which combine to build and knit together our shared Dream.

Yet it must be noted that in recent times the Barony, Canton and College have been blessed by many newcomers, some of whom have yet to acquire certain of the skills and attributes possessed by those who have been here longer. And also that certain of the more long-standing inhabitants of the Barony may have become complacent or perhaps somewhat narrow in their focus, and may no longer practice some of their skills with the same aplomb and dexterity as once they did.

Thus it is that Bartholomew and Katherine, Baron and Baroness of Southron Gaard, hereby challenge each and every member of the populace of the Barony, Canton and College to join the Renaissance -- not in persona terms, but in the expression of your accomplishments. In our eyes, a Renaissance individual can dance, sing, fight, write, cook, and more, acquitting themselves well in all the Courtly Arts.

Therefore we say to each of you - look not to your previous achievements. Starting from now, and for the space of a twelve-month, set out to build or demonstrate your capabilities in the following areas:

- * The Arts Martial - by contesting at an event in a tournament of heavy fighting, of rapier or of archery, or by stewarding or marshalling the same.
- * The Written Arts - by devising an illumination or calligraphy, or composing a letter suitable for your time and place and entering the same in an arts display or competition.
- * The Performing Arts - by learning and performing period pieces or in a period style at an event thus: four songs, or four dances, or a dramatic piece or story -- or preferably doing all three!
- * The Culinary Arts - preparing and serving at an event a period dish for twenty or more gentles, or a group of period dishes for four or more.
- * A Craft - by making two distinct items of a period nature or purpose, such as garb, accessories, leatherwork, tokens, banner, weapon or armour, and demonstrating them to others by entering them in an arts display or competition.
- * In Service - by stewarding an event or a significant portion of an event, or by undertaking specific service to the Barony or Kingdom.

Take up this challenge, learn new skills or polish old ones, assist others to achieve their Dream. To those who achieve these goals before Baronial Anniversary next will be awarded a special token and great honour, for they will truly be a Renaissance Gentle.
