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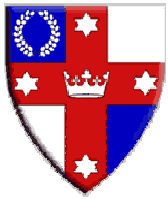
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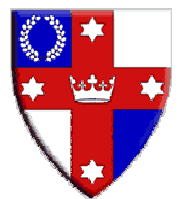

## An Introduction to Stewarding

Stewarding an event is too much hard work and stress? Wrong! Stewarding an event can be incredibly rewarding as you see your initial tiny idea grow to a reality where people have fun at something you have created. If you are well prepared then you can even relax and enjoy your own event. (Ok, I am still working on this one but I can see it happening one day.)

This is the first in a series of articles aimed at helping people who want to steward events but are not sure where to start or how to go about it. I welcome contributions and ideas from other past Stewards in the Barony for future articles! There is also plenty of good advice and guidance on the Southron Gaard website at

I write partly from my own experiences as a Steward this year and in the distant past. I also have learnt much through listening to and helping much more experienced Stewards especially those in my household.

### Step One: Choosing the type of event you want to Steward

Events come in many different shapes and sizes and picking the right event for you as a Steward is critical. But what type of events could you run? Below are some ideas of possible event types:

**Feast** – a higher end event with good food, pageantry, singing, dancing

**Collegium** – a series of classes about SCA matters – Arts and Sciences, fighting, archery, rapier, history, etiquette etc

**Tournament** – a chance for the heavy fighters to show their prowess on the field – could also be or include rapier too!

**Tavern Revel** – food, singing and socialising but more relaxed than a feast

**Ball** – dancing and a chance to show off your good garb!

**Archery event** – competition to show the accuracy of our Baronial archers

**Rapier event** – could have classes and/or a tournament for the rapier fighters

**Games event** – a series of period themed games. Many long time members of the Barony remember the Celtic Games with the infamous Potato Hunt and Toss the Roman contests.

**Picnic** - formal or informal chance to dress up, eat and socialise in a pleasant location

**Camping Event** – an opportunity to be immersed in the SCA for a weekend or longer – could include cooking, fighting, A&S classes...

This is by no means an exhaustive list and a number of these options could be combined for a fantastic event!

As a Steward you need to think about how much time and energy you have to give. All events do take time and effort but some take much more than others. If you are particularly busy with work or study then give Stewarding a break until a quieter period in your life or if you are still busy but think you have some spare time look to running something more low key like a revel or picnic. When you put your event bid to council you must be committed to running an event and be prepared to give it the time it needs otherwise you will be doomed to much stress and anxiety or create disappointment in the Barony when your event does not go ahead. (Having said that sometimes life gets uncomfortably in the way just when you wish it would go off and bother someone else!)

Other considerations for a potential Steward include finding a feast cook (there are quite a number of these in the Barony), available venues, the time of the year e.g. don't plan a

tournament in July, what other events are on – there is no use having five balls in a row and the price of your event, do you want to run a cheap or expensive event?

### **Step Two: Choosing a theme**

There are different trains of thoughts about themed events. I personally think that a theme gives an event a sense of direction and purpose. If it is handled properly it injects atmosphere in to an event. If you are running an event like Baronial Anniversary or Yule then there is a ready-made theme for you to work from. However, there are other ways to give your event a theme. These include choosing a particular period in time or culture to base your event around. Some ideas here could be the Court of Henry VIII, the Medici in 16<sup>th</sup> century Florence, Anglo-Saxon England or 14<sup>th</sup> century France, the Persian Court... Or you could pick a particular historical event as a theme such as the Battle of Poitiers, the fall of Byzantium, the capture of Jerusalem during the Crusades... There are many other options, which I am sure you can come up with yourselves!

Another way of looking at it is to pick a concept and have an event such as the Tournament of Courtly Love, the Feast of St George or the Revel of Bacchus. (Yes, these are all a bit lame and I expect you to come up with something much more creative).

The important point with themes is that once you have picked a theme commit to it and try to incorporate it in to your event as much as possible. There is no use having the Feast of St George and not mentioning St George once during the whole day. I will discuss in a later article how to incorporate your theme in to your event.

### **Step Three: Choosing a venue**

The most important thing to remember is that your venue must match your event type! Sounds like a no-brainer but there are a number of important considerations.

**The kitchen** – If you are planning to serve food then you must have a kitchen suited to your event. You can get away with a small kitchen for revels but if you are wanting to cook a feast then make sure you have the necessary equipment and space for the cook to do so. Do not expect your cook to be able to cook for 100 people on one elderly oven in a kitchen the size of a postage stamp! It is possible to hire ovens and other kitchen equipment but make sure there is space for them in the kitchen. A very good idea is to take your cook/s along with you when checking out a venue to make sure the space works for them.

**Atmosphere** – This does come down to what type of event you want to run. However, it is hard to get the right atmosphere for an SCA event in a glaringly modern hall. Some of the more appropriate venues are hideously expensive but there are some nice halls out there that with a little bit of work on the part of the Steward can create the right feeling. Banners and wall hangings add a huge amount of atmosphere to a mediocre hall. Remember that what makes the SCA is that moment where you feel you have stepped back in time. This makes it worth the extra effort to find the right venue and put up and/or make some banners or wall hangings.

**Tournaments** – A current problem with running tournaments is finding somewhere that will allow us to put up tents. Many of the venues around the city are reluctant to allow us to put tent pegs in the ground because of irrigation systems. If you are running a tournament and want to use tents and sunshades check with your site first to make sure that it is okay to do so. Another important consideration with tournaments is making sure there are close and adequate toilet facilities!

**Archery** – finding space for an archery event can sometimes be a problem as there must be a clear, safe area for them to shoot in. If you are unsure of the requirements here then check with the Captain of Archers. However, the



archers will love you forever if you can find them space!

**Camping Event** – camping events are dictated by the facilities available on site.

- Do make sure that the bathroom space is adequate for the number of expected participants.
- Another consideration is bunkrooms – you will possibly have more attendees if you have bunkrooms available but there are few reasonably priced sites that have this option. Quite a number of people either own tents or can borrow them so do not let a lack of bunk rooms put you off running a camping event.
- Think about how far out of town the campsite is – if it is too far off the beaten track then you will not have many day-trippers. Again do not let this put you off the perfect site as people are quite often prepared to travel the distance for that special event!
- Timing is very important when it comes to camping events – people will be more likely to make an effort to camp if it is over a long weekend as the extra day allows more time to for set up and pack down.

- Finally, think about where you are going to put things on the site – what is the best area for the tournament, where can you have archery, which is the designated camping area? Be very clear to people about where they can/cannot camp as you do not want tents springing up on the archery range.

So where can I have my event? There are some sites listed on the Southron Gaard stewarding page

and it is a good idea to have a chat to past Stewards about their experiences.

Event type, theme and venue are the first three important considerations when it comes to stewarding an event. In terms of timeframe, I would suggest for a high-end event you should start considering these things no less than six months out from the event. For a quieter event I would think around four months will give you enough time to organise your event.

I hope that this article gives you some thoughts and inspiration about stewarding and does not put you off, as stewarding is a fun and rewarding experience!

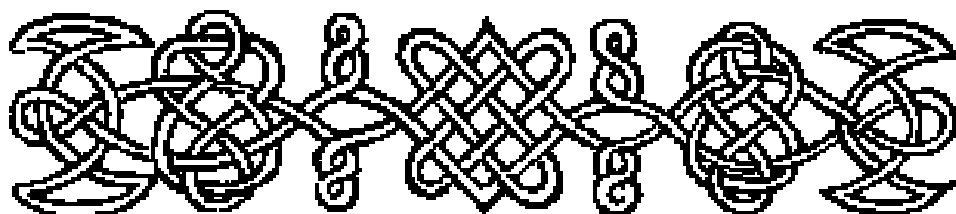

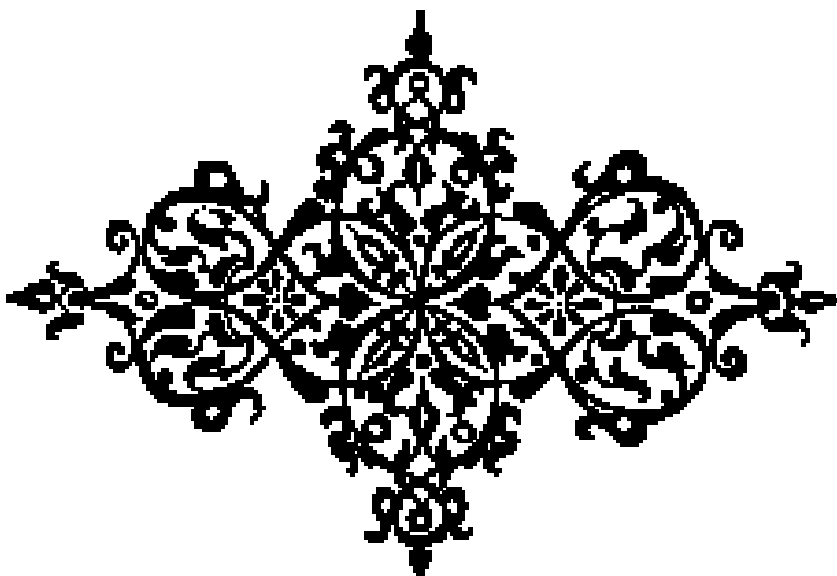
