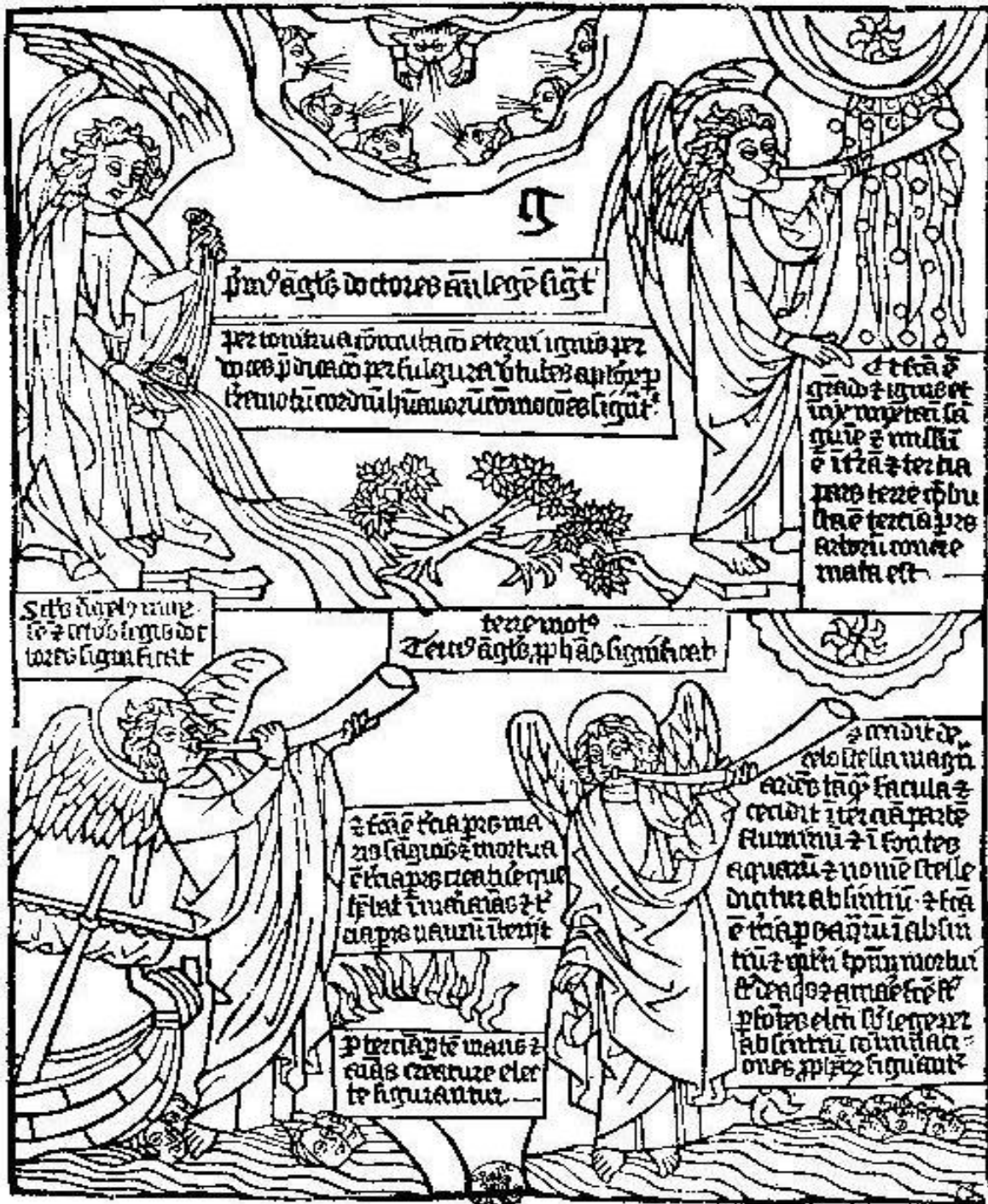

Their Excellencies Speak....



The quiet of a Southron Gaard winter is steadily giving way to the sounds of smiths' hammers pounding armour and siege engines under construction. Soon, we hope, it will be joined by a martial hubbub as growing numbers attend the heavy fighting, archery and mixed combat practises each week.

Over a dozen new helms and as many other pieces of armour arrived in the Barony last month, and still more armour, maille and weaponry is being built. Building the fitness and skills to use it takes more sustained effort.

Meanwhile, several teams of engineers are engaged in designing and building a range of siege weapons, among them at least one trebuchet, ballista and cannon. Those which are completed by early December will compete in the Siege Engine Challenge -- a three-day encampment involving a wide range of activities both martial and civilised - of which more is revealed elsewhere in this issue of FTT.

All of which is no more than preliminaries for the first big challenge we will face next year -- Canterbury Faire.

Outwardly, the Barony of Ildhafn appears at present to be engaged in internecine strife. Our agent recently reported: "Our illustrious B&B have started another war - with each other. Over who provides the most valuable input at our events -- the Lords or the Ladies!!!"

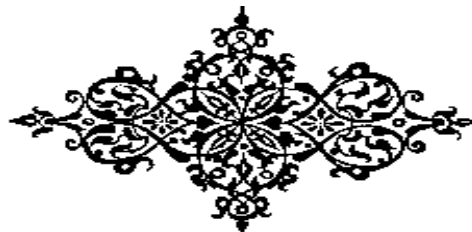
This, of course, is no more than a ruse. Baron Inigo has made it quite clear he has ambitions towards the South, and has already begun to make unreasonable demands, including one involving a certain member of our Court (as we recall, the term "chastity codpiece" may have been mentioned).

Darton's position is not known at this time, but we would be unwise to entrust ourselves to their support should hostilities be forced upon us. And, while we are very close to securing alliances with large Baronies in Terra Rosa, it's very clear we

must continue to make substantial efforts to improve our own military capability.

So keep those forges aglow, hammers pounding and siege engines abuilding, and we hope to see more of you at practices and musters!

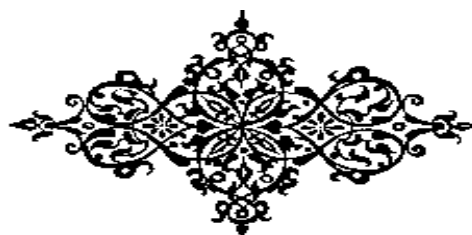
If so, please join the Southron Gaard singing group led by Lady Elen Benet on Thursdays from 7.30 - 8.30 pm. All levels of experience are welcome.

Child rates apply for 5-12 year olds, under-5s free

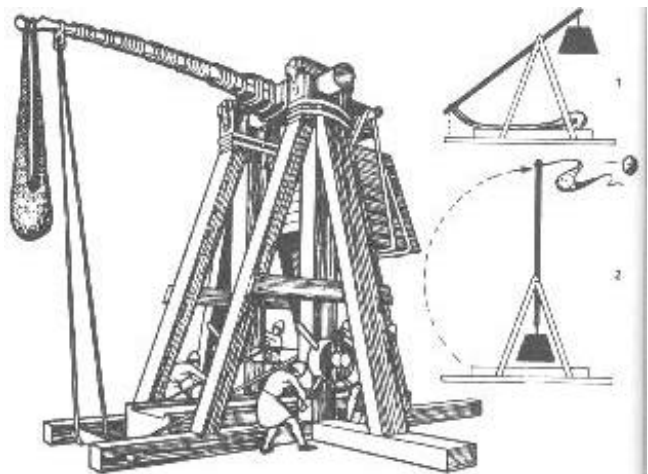

December Quarter event: Webpage up, ad in FTT next month.

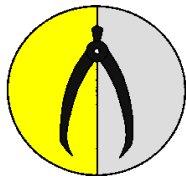
GENERAL BUSINESS:

Baronial & Pavilion Hangings Project

Unto the gifted embroiderers of Southron Gaard, does katherine kerr send her greetings, and a plea for you to demonstrate the skills you have and the beauty we know well you can create.

Hangings are needed to brighten up the Baronial Pavilion at Canterbury Faire where we intend it be used as a dining area and meeting place for visiting baronages and royalty who may grace our fair shores.

and

The Barony has available to it a large amount of Habutai silk and silk dyes, and will be making two large banners to fly at Canterbury Faire, Festival and elsewhere.

These will be 2m x 2m and one will display the arms of Southron Gaard, the other the Kingdom arms.

Spare silk and dyes will be available for purchase by anyone wishing to make their own silk standard (NB: silk must be used for standard or banner production only, no garb!).

The production techniques involved are not particularly difficult. We will be using acrylic fabric paint to draw the outlines of any design; the dyes are then painted on within the lines (known as the serti technique). Testing has shown the dyes to be easy to apply and control, and relatively quick to dry. A small amount of ironing helps to set the paint/dye and keeps the colours vibrant.
